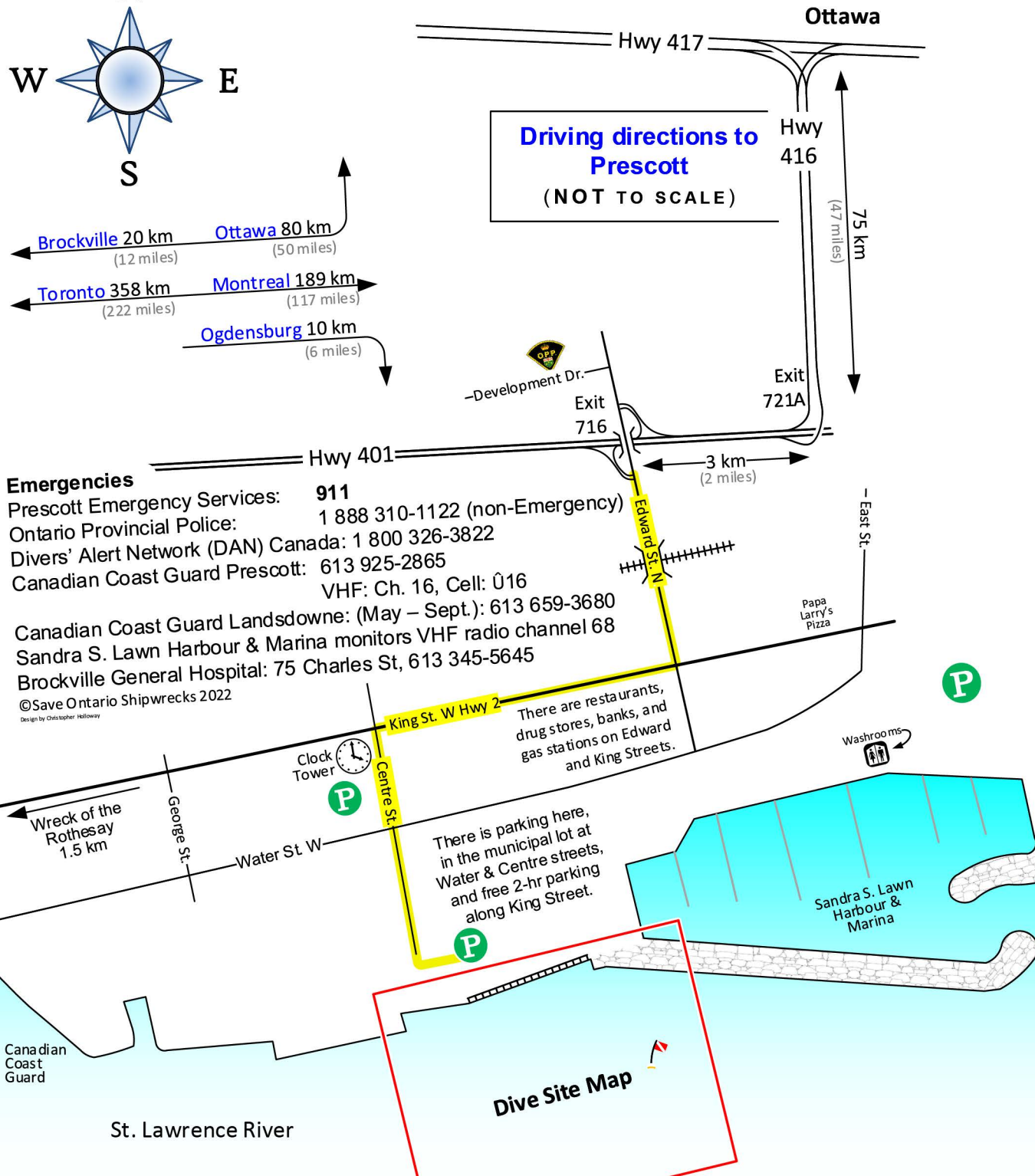


Brockville 20 km (12 miles)

Description:

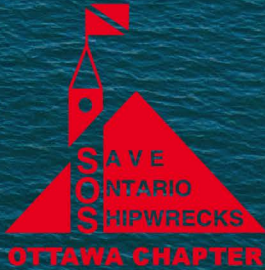
Prescott is ideal for practicing your diving skills, with minimal current, things to see, and manageable depths. There are guide lines at the site, and if you get lost, go north to return to shore.

Access:

Parking can be an issue on busy days. Shore-side spots are for temporary parking only, or drop off your equipment and park on the east side of the marina, or by the clock tower. The Scuba Park Staging Shelter can be used as a changing area and for storing equipment while on-site. There are washroom facilities located on the west side of the shelter. Respect the park by not littering. This is a shore dive with a ramp entry and site amenities provided by the Town of Prescott (thank you Prescott). After entering at the ramp, follow either line from the ramp to the platforms.

Conditions:

Depth: < 13m (42') Depth is noted on this map in the Red Circles
Visibility: 1.5m to 15m (5' to 50'). Visibility increases away from shore/weeds and into the current.
Bottom: Rocks and some shore weeds/vegetation, otherwise silty.
Current: Further from shore, there is a slight current (~1 kph) heading east.
Water: 0°C (32° F) in February to 26°C (79° F) in July with no thermocline.
Hazards: Large cruise boats/personal yachts docking at port of call. Sailboats (silent but dangerous), motorboats (noisy and more dangerous), and personal watercraft come close to shore.
